From pristine beaches to bustling cityscapes, the region is home to a host of film locations for rent, making it popular with international location scouts. The landscape related expenses to movies and TV shows that shoot is dynamic and the quality of light is excellent during the summer months due to the Mediterranean climate.

2. Expert Crew

The region has access to any person you may need on your production team in terms of behind-the-scenes experts. Forget about flying your entire crew to the region, the Western Cape has amazing professionals who understand the importance of matching their work ethic to the client brief, giving producers only the best.





ASSOCIATIONS SUPPORTING THE INDUSTRY

outh Africa has a robust set of association bodies and organisations active in the film industry. Ranging from the commercials sector to film production of various types, to crew, talent and specialist services, there is a body available to assist and support.

The main bodies supporting the commercials sector are the Commercial Producers Association and the South African Association of Stills Producers, while many of the other bodies are members of SASFED the South African Screen Federation. These include but are not limited to the Independent Producers Organisation, the Documentary Filmmakers Association, pages. Here, you will find information on what work Animation South Africa, the South African Guild of Actors, the South African Guild of Editors, the National Association of Location Agents, and many others.

Not only do these bodies support their local membership bases, but many of them also facilitate in bringing international productions to the country, assist other governmental bodies and private sector in coming together to support the rights and needs of the film industry, and provide a much-needed voice and education at film festivals, markets, workshops and other places.

In order to help you connect with these bodies and explore how they fit into the local film, television and commercials landscape, we have compiled a breakdown of associations and organisations on the following they do, how they have remained active during and post-pandemic, and the main pillars and principles that ground each one. •

COMMERCIAL PRODUCERS ASSOCIATION OF SA



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SACIA

The Southern African Communications Industries Association (SACIA) is a SAQA-recognised professional body that develops and awards professional designations to industry professionals working in the film and video industry.

"Our designations are all listed on the National Qualifications Framework and are awarded based on an assessment that examines an individual's knowledge, experience, competence and ethics," explains Kevan Jones, Executive Director of SACIA. "There are many people working in the film industry who have no formal qualifications relating to their sphere of expertise, and while a review of an individual's education is a vital component of the assessment, it is also possible for individuals to earn a designation based on a recognition of prior learning (RPL) or workplace learning."

"A key aspect of working in the film and television industry is that you learn as you go," he adds. "Each new production throws up a fresh

challenge, and every person in a production crew is always on their toes." Because of this, every designated individual is required to participate in a programme of continuing professional development that keeps them up to date with the trends and technologies shaping the future of the industry.

SACIA currently awards designations to cinematographers, actors, picture and sound editors, audio-visual technicians, and theatre technicians. They are also working with SWIFT to develop a professional designation for on-set intimacy co-ordinators, with the PMA to establish a professional designation for talent management, and with the IPO to create a professional designation for producers and directors. "By working with other Associations in our sector, we can drive an industry-wide commitment to professional standards and ethical business practices." concludes Jones.

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SOUTH AFRICAN ACTORS

The South African Guild of Actors (SAGA) represents professional actors in the film, television, theatre. commercial and corporate sectors in South Africa.

SAGA was constituted on 23 July 2009 and is a non-profit organisation (NPO number 119-128), a Public Benefit Organisation (PBO No: 930041853) and a Section 21 Company (Reg. 2012/073405/08).

SAGA's mandate is to represent the legal and economic rights of professional actors. SAGA offers legal support to its members through a coalition agreement with the UASA Trade Union

as well as contractual legal support as independent contractors.

SAGA has been a member of South African Screen Federation since 2009, where collaboration of the independent production sector includes producers, writers, editors, agents, animators and actors' organisations, ensuring that the sector retains professional standards. The Cape Overberg has always been considered as the breadbasket of the Cape due to grain farming in the area. Farms and wheat fields are bordered by mountains covered in fynbos and coastal scenes with many shades of blue. One of the most scenic drives in the world, Clarence Drive or locally known as the R44, is a popular setting especially for vehicle commercials. The same goes for the gravel roads through the forests in Elgin Valley Grabouw.

THE GATEWAY TO FILM AND TV IN AFRICA

he Western Cape has long been renowned for its expertise, capabilities and amazing diversity of locations, so it's no wonder that the province has played host to most of Hollywood's biggest studio execs, including Disney, Cinemax, HBO, Sony and many others. Often lauded as offering 'the world in one country', the Cape has doubled as most countries across the world - with many of these unique locations found within two hours of the Cape Town city centre. This, together with South Africa's Foreign Film Incentive have continued to attract internationals from across the globe, and although the Western Cape saw fewer productions take place as a result of the pandemic in 2020, the industry is beginning to pick up steam and welcome their worldwide peers back with vigour.

Overcoming Any Challenge

The last Filmmaker's Guide was launched midway through Covid-19, just as film protocols were being released and global lockdowns were slowing. That said, South Africa's situation has been in flux, and this has naturally impacted the number of productions shooting in the Cape, as well as the way in which productions are conducted. Cast and crew maintain strict governmental regulations during principal photography, and shoot times have become more arduous, albeit necessary, in order to accommodate the stringent testing, quarantine and travel requirements as a result of the pandemic.

If the Western Cape's 2018 water shortage was anything to go by, the many individuals and companies working in the sector have proved that they have the innovation and ability to navigate any challenge, no

matter how large. These days, water is not scarce, but many productions still insist on saving water wherever possible. More and more local companies are also considering sustainability components in their production plans to ensure they become more ecofriendly and waste less. Expertise in Every Area

Based on the Western Cape's track record, it suffices to say that the industry offers all one needs to successfully pull off a shoot of any size. From the location and production company, to talent and crew, to technical expertise such as post-production, VFX and sound, the region has it all.

In the last few years, the Cape has welcomed highprofile productions like Ridley Scott's Raised By Wolves, and the Bruce Lee-inspired Warrior, both of which

have shot both their first and second season here. Most recently, it was announced that Sony's latest production, an intrinsically African story called The Woman King, will be shot here, too.

In terms of shorter formats, commercial producers have been pushing boundaries with virtual shoots to help reduce international travel where possible. Animation, too, has had its moment in the spotlight, with Cape Town-based Triggerfish announcing series with Netflix, Disney, and setting up shop in Ireland in the last 12 months. Local productions have also had their moment in the spotlight since lockdown last year, with so many unique stories coming to the fore as the demand for online content has steadily and dramatically increased. Earlier this year, local documentary My Octopus Teacher made waves internationally on Netflix and also won itself an Oscar, a BAFTA and a slew of other very deserved awards.

With all these positive points, it's easy to see how the Western Cape continues to lead the continent in its ability to host, assist and even produce incredible, entertaining content. •


LEVATING THE WESTERN CAPE'S

AN EXPLORATION OF HUMANITY'S

PLACE IN THE UNIVERSE



he film !AITSA has been making waves since its release, with audiences captivated by its stunning visuals and thought-provoking themes. We recently spoke to the director of !AITSA, Dane Dodds, to gain insight into the creation of the film and its message.

When guestioned about the name of the documentary Dane said. "The word "AITSA" embodies the essence of the film as one of the earliest words in spoken language to express exclamation," he explains. "By using this name, I hoped to evoke a sense of wonder and transcendence, in line with the themes explored in the film. Additionally, the use of a Bushman word highlights the cultural and historical significance of the Great Karoo, including its more recent colonial past, as represented by the adoption of the word into the Afrikaans language."

Dane grew up in the Karoo, and the region has been an important part of his family's identity for generations. "Seven generations of my family have found identity and a divine understanding of the universe in the Karoo, and now I am seeking to find my own." he says. "My work aims to heal, as I work with the medicinal plant biomes from the Karoo and have a deep connection to the people, energies, and powers of the earth that are present here. As a curious storyteller, I am fascinated by the parallel stories that can be observed in the Karoo, where science and spirit explore deep into time and

With its focus on humanity's place in the universe, !AITSA features a diverse range of speakers, each offering their perspective on the meaning of existence. Dane



explains that the casting process was deliberate, seeking to reflect a broad range of viewpoints. "We reached out to individuals who were affiliated with the Karoo and the topics we wanted to explore," he says.

So, what does Dane hope viewers will take away from watching !AITSA? "I made !AITSA as an exploration of mankind's attempt to understand our place in the universe by exploring the place where we collectively originate as humans," he explains. "The film seeks to explore the different human interpretations of what life is, where we are, and what the act of finding out is doing to us. I hope that viewers will experience the vastness of the universe and that the film provides healing perspectives. That the audience is drawn towards the essence of the film and that minds and hearts are opened."

Dane's connection to the Karoo is evident in the film, and he hopes that viewers will appreciate the beauty of the region as much as he does. "When you are from somewhere, you often don't appreciate the beauty that is right in front of you, like an artwork you grew up with hanging in your parent's house," he says, "It takes something special to make you take a closer look at it, and this film is intended to be that special something."





The film takes a day-in-the-life approach, revealing the daily struggles and hardships of a group of mostly black and coloured students who face numerous challenges, including a lack of qualified teachers.

When asked what he hopes the viewers take away from the film Solker said "To create positive change in South Africa, we need to make changes at the school level, and it is my hope that the film conveys this."

he Western Cape's unit stills and photography industry has continued to evolve and grow, with many talented photographers and filmmakers choosing to make their home in the region. Today, the Western Cape is home to a thriving creative community that includes photographers, filmmakers, artists, and designers from all over the world.

The region is no stranger to welcoming international stars and capturing them on-set and behind the scenes on high-profile productions annually. Some of South Africa's most talented unit stills photographers are based here and have worked on the likes of Raised by Wolves, African Queens: Njinga, Catch Me A Killer, The Last Post, Redeeming Love, The Crown, and many others in the last few years.

The images captured by unit stills photographers contribute to a film's success by captivating the audience's interest before the show is released. The first look image of a movie provides a glimpse into the visual style, tone, and atmosphere of the film. The image is usually carefully selected to generate

buzz and anticipation for the film and may feature key actors or elements of the story.

It is fair to say that the unit stills and photography industry in the region is currently experiencing significant change and transformation. The emergence of new technologies and platforms has disrupted the traditional ways of working in the industry. South African photographer Coco Van Oppens believes that the role of the unit stills photographer will continue to evolve in the film

industry as it adapts to these new technologies and as audiences become more sophisticated.

"While the role of the unit stills photographer may evolve in response to changes in the film industry, the core function of capturing compelling and memorable images to promote and market the film will likely remain central to the role," Van Oppens suggests.

With her keen eye and ability to capture moments that evoke emotion and tell a story in a single frame, Van Oppens continues to contribute to the success of films through her stunning stills photography.

Local stills photographer Joe Alblas, who heads up African Photo Productions, knows that images create indelible memories like no other medium can. With motion picture stills, the challenge is

to capture the essence of a story or scene with a single image within the conception of the overall film or series. Achieving this clarity is his passion. As the demand for content is increasing post-Covid. and more film projects are being rolled out in Sub-Saharan Africa, it is essential to upskill and train crews in all the departments involved in filmmaking.

"We currently have no curriculum in place at any educational institution to tutor photography graduates in becoming on-set unit still photographers. We have already trained and mentored a number of individuals over the years in this field who have all become successful either as self-employed photographers or full-time employees of specialist companies. Therefore, a worthwhile opportunity now exists for us to share all the knowledge we have accumulated in this specialist field over the years and develop a programme to produce a stable of trainees who will embark on an apprenticeship career path," says Alblas.

Looking ahead, it is likely that the stills and photography industry in the Western Cape will continue to evolve and adapt to the rapid rise of new emerging technologies and changing market conditions. However, with its rich history, talented community, and stunning landscapes, the region is sure to remain a major player in the global photography and film making industry for many years to come.**⊙**

SUSTAINABLE FILMMAKING A GLOBAL BEST PRACTICE

GREENSET was invited by Ontario Green Screen to represent South Africa on a panel discussion on "Measuring Impact - Using Data to Drive Change", at The Sustainable Production Forum 2022, alongside film industry sustainability leaders. ALBERT and ITV's Head of Sustainability. In doing so, the message we sent to the world was that the South African film industry is going green. We are collecting the data and we are working towards reducing our carbon footprint on productions that film in our region.





In 2022 the Film industry in Cape Town:

- Employed 28 sustainability crew on Longform & TV Productions, Series and Commercials,
- Diverted 1300 tonnes of waste from Cape Town landfills.
- Funded the development of a polyurethane recycling machine prototype and funded an upgrade to this machine. As a result, no polyurethane set waste will ever need to be sent to landfills in Cape Town again.
- Donated the first 1600 building blocks made of polyurethane set waste to the Ulwazi Educare
- Partnered with Envirolite to divert all polystyrene - on GREENSET productions - from landfill.
- Tested the first electric generator, Rand Air's ZBC, on a film set in Africa.
- Placed 7 hybrid vehicles on productions.
- Avoided using thousands of single-use plastic water bottles by actively championing and using water trailers and watercoolers on set.
- Switched from non-recyclable food packaging to recyclable & biodegradable packaging.
- Established a circular economy hub for donation and upcycling of set timber at The Ark & organic waste to community gardens.



GREENSET is a Non-Profit Company partnering with producers to calculate the carbon footprint, minimize waste and the overall environmental impact on productions, by implementing practical, economical, green initiatives. GREENSET's focus is on life, occupational, entrepreneurial skills development, and in-service training – employment creation and career path development. GREENSET is working toward the United Nations' Sustainable Development Goals (SDGs), driving project-specific sustainability communication strategies and viable, operational roll-out while actively encouraging crew and cast to decarbonize the film industry and raise awareness of sustainability in homes and surrounding communities.

In 2022, GREENSET released the Raised by Wolves (RBW) Season 2 Sustainability Report as well as a short Sustainability BTS video, both of which are featured on the Green Production Guide's website (www.greenproductionguide.com). Scott Free's Head of Production, Marjorie Chodorov, said: "This is the most stellar green initiative I have seen on a production".

The Woman King was awarded a Gold EMA Seal for Sustainability, and Devils Peak received an ALBERT 2-star rating. In 2022 sustainability crew worked on Panda, Warrior S3, and Kanii – all of which are in line for EMA Sustainability Seals.

To all the Sustainability Coordinators, Eco-Stewards, and Green PAs who worked so hard in 2022, to the Production Companies, amazing Line-Producers, and all the Crew and Cast, thank you for helping reduce our environmental impact and making the South African film industry more sustainable. We look forward to the exciting sustainability challenges of 2023.

echnology has caused a paradigm shift in the film industry, from the way the picture is shot to post-production and editing to distribution and marketing. Technology is giving the film industry a much-needed competitive advantage.


The use of technology has increased the qualitative components of filmmaking, as new technologies ensure engaging and sharp images. enhanced sound effects, easier editing tools, and digital film distribution, all of which contribute to providing spectators with an enhanced movie experience.

Film Shooting

The filmmaking process has been altered by digital cameras and can now easily capture movies with a high frame rate in super fine 4K, 8K, or HD format using big format sensor cameras and lenses.

Production Cost

Technology has indeed helped filmmakers to reduce the overall cost of filmmaking. Filmmakers can shoot, edit, preserve and store the digital copies of their movies. The use of digital cameras and other technology aids in the production of a film in less time than traditional film cameras. The digital format also allows filmmakers to finish their schedules in less time with nearly no waste, allowing them to keep production costs under control.

Editing

Editing occurs during the post-production stage, when digital technology allows editors to work on different sections and put them together to create a clean film. With a variety of film-editing tools that allows editors to effortlessly integrate video




Film Distribution

Filmmakers can publish their films on OTT channels in order to reach consumers outside of traditional theaters and multiplexes. Movie rights can now be given digitally to consumers, ushering in an exciting new era of film distribution.

New technologies are pushing filmmaking to new heights

The business of filmmaking has been revolutionised with the usage of state-of-the-art technologies. We can see how advanced gadgets, innovative audiovisual techniques, hardware, and applications have been used to deliver enthralling visuals with ease.





3D and 4K-8K Technology

3D effects coupled with 4K technology have transformed the experience of sci-fi movies and action dramas. Filmmakers can use Lucid camera, VR technology, and high-definition formats to shoot 3-Dimensional videos with 4K or 8K resolution. This technology helps filmmakers to shoot underwater scenes, multiple angles, and high-octane action scenes to deliver an immersive experience to the viewers.



Drones

Gone are the days when low-flying aircraft or helicopters were used to shoot panoramic or bird's eye-view scenes. Those shots were known to come at a high cost along with stabilisation issues.

Fast forward to 2023 and drones came as a very useful and handy technology, that enable the filmmakers to obtain such shots with fewer complications and at a much less cost. Drones could be used to shoot high-fidelity action scenes with finesse, and that's why drones have become the preferred alternative to aircraft and helicopters.

With their compact size manoeuvrability, and relatively cheaper pricing than a lot of legacy equipment, drones allow filmmakers to achieve more with less. Drones generally only take one person to operate and achieve stunning aerial shots that can be the cherry on top of any film. Before drones, these shots were done with the use of helicopters, which are extremely expensive. Although a good quality drone won't come cheap, it is considerably cheaper than the cost of a helicopter, considering you'd have to factor in fuel and a wage for the helicopter pilot.

Multi-Dimensional Movie Technology

There has been an incremental change in multidimensional movie technology. The film industry has reached a stage where the 3D viewing experience is viable without any external gadget or spectacle.

Now we have moved to 7D or 8D movies, where viewers can experience computer- controlled swing, shake, fall, rise, spray water, air, and other special effects. Multi-dimensional technologies let the audience enjoy the visual, auditory, dynamic, and tactile aspects of the movie.

often called, in the 43-year history of the awards.

Hailing from Stellenbosch in the Western Cape, Good Life was Payne's first-ever feature film, it was filmed entirely in the city of Cape Town, during the 2020 lockdown. Payne's acting career began when he was just six years old, having starred in commercials. His focus on acting comes as a result of being "unschooled", a style of homeschooling which does not follow a set curriculum. This allowed Payne to focus all of his energy on his acting career.

The film in question, "Good Life", is a South African film which centres around a brokenhearted woman who flees Cape Town for Greece, where she forms an unlikely friendship with a young boy, Jet, played by Payne. The film also won an award for Best Feature Film at the Berlin Independent Film Festival.

Payne and his fellow nominees Tristan Riggs (The Seventh Day) and Violet McGraw (Separation) attended the award ceremony in Los Angeles on 2 October 2022. Previous recipients of Payne's award include the likes of Zendaya, Drake, Julia Roberts, Regina King, and Leonardo DiCaprio.

Payne has also had numerous appearances in a variety of films and series including The Kissing Booth 3 (Netflix, 2022), Resident Evil (Netflix, 2022), Warrior seasons 1 and 2 (HBO 2018-), and Lincoln (History, 2021).

he South African Netflix Original Series,

TRIGGERFISH ANIMATION IN AFRICA

he art of animation has steadily gained popularity in Africa, with African studios continuing to make waves in the animation industry, both nationally and internationally, as well as collaborations with some of the biggest names in the industry including Netflix and Disney+.

One notable example of a pioneer in this industry is the Cape Town-based animation studio Triggerfish, which recently partnered up with Netflix to launch the Story Artist Lab, a paid skills development programme launched in 2021, following the success of the Female Writers Lab. The purpose of the program was to attract fresh talent, as well as seasoned creatives, and upskill the next generation of storytellers and artists in the African animation industry.

On more recent projects, Triggerfish is excited to bring the adventures of a new African superhero, Kiya, to children round the world. Kiya is the heroine in the animated action-adventure series called Kiya & the Kimoja Heroes –a show about a trio of friends that combine their everyday passions with extraordinary powers and teamwork. The series takes place in the

fictional v, a city inspired by the sights and sounds of southern Africa.

An original concept by Robert Vargas, adapted from characters created by South Africans Marc Dey and Kelly Dillon, this action-adventure animated series follows Kiya, a seven-year-old African girl who was inspired by the antics of Dey's daughter who played dress-up as a ninja-princess but also saves the world, and, through Kiya, the team has wonderfully captured this duality in a heroine who boldly shines bright and makes things right with her two friends.

The project is the first success from Triggerfish's 2015 Story Lab initiative that saw Dey and Dillon selected as part of a cohort of emerging creators from around Africa. The project was selected out of almost 1,400 ideas and now joins Netflix's Supa Team 4 (previously Mama K's Team 4) that was also developed as part of the Story Lab. Triggerfish's award-winning producers Anthony Silverston and Vanessa Sinden brought the series to the global market with the series being produced by Frog Box for Hasbro's entertainment studio, eONE. Samson, who contributed to the design of the original character during the development phase, was brought back to work on the show. Malcolm Wope (designer on Supa Team 4 and Triggerfish's third feature film, Seal Team) consulted on the initial direction of the martial art elements for this project.

Kiya & the Kimoja Heroes is the product of Triggerfish's vision of bringing African stories, voices, and creativity to the global market and taking African animation excellence to the world. "Our belief is that Kiya will represent and empower young girls to be leaders who can use their smarts and skills to solve big problems," says Tshepo Moche, writer and creative consultant at Triggerfish. "While Kiya is not the first Black female protagonist in children's programming, there is still a tremendous opportunity for representation. There has never been a better moment for the landscape of children's programming to reflect the diversity and size of the audience they serve."

The visual style of the series was originally developed by South African artists inspired by the

vibrant and culturally diverse Bo-kaap neighbourhood of Cape Town. The look was further developed by Cape Town studio, Tulips and Chimneys and Frog Box in development and production in France. Kiya & the Kimoja Heroes is a show celebrating confidence, diversity and community. It prides itself in deviating from showing girls only as princesses, offering an opportunity to represent and empower young girls – especially since pre-school action superhero stories traditionally skews to young boys and rarely feature black girls as leads.

Triggerfish is currently working with both Dey and Dillion on other properties in development, including; Rosy Days, a series based on Kelly's short film Belly Flop, and Tonko, created by Terence Maluleke, who is one of the directors in the Kizazi Moto: Generation Fire anthology.


